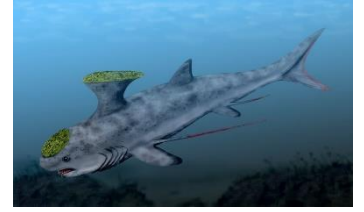


TorreAbbey Make a Prehistoric Shark!

Here's how to make your own cardboard *Stethacanthus*!

You will need:

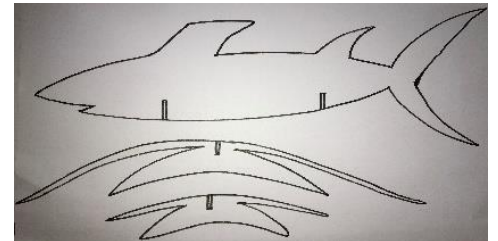
- Cardboard
- Scissors
- Pencil or black pen
- Colouring materials
(Oil pastels, colouring pens, crayons or paints)



How to create your cardboard prehistoric shark:

(A mini tutorial video is available to follow along with this instruction leaflet)

1. Draw the main shape of your shark and its fins on the cardboard.
2. Cut out the pieces of your shark carefully - ask a parent to help you with this as the card can be quite difficult to cut.
3. Ensure that you cut the slots for the pieces to be attached together.
4. Colour and decorate the pieces of your shark using your oil pastels, crayons, pens or paints.
5. Slot the fins onto the main body of the shark and bend each fin backwards slightly.
6. Stand your shark up and take a photo of your creation!
